AIRSIDE SAFETY INFORMATION



SAFETY PROCEDURES



At Saint-Barthelemy's airport, passengers occasionally have to cross the apron to reach their aircraft. This can expose them to hazards such as aircraft starting up or moving across the apron.

Aerodrome operator, airlines and ground handlers are all responsible for ensuring that passenger movements to and from their aircraft are supervised and monitored in a safe manner.

The following safety instructions therefore apply at Saint-Barthelemy's airport :

- Passengers are only allowed airside if accompanied and supervised by authorized airside personnel ;**
- Passengers must remain in small groups on the green area before accessing the aircraft/terminal and follow the safe route across the apron indicated by the authorized staff ;**
- Passengers must not pass below aircraft wings, close to propellers and stay clear of vehicle traffic and ramp equipment ;**
- Priority is given to disembarking passengers.**





SAFETY PROCEDURES



Passengers only embark and disembark an aircraft when the engines are shut down and the propellers have stopped turning.



1 The rotating propellers are barely visible.



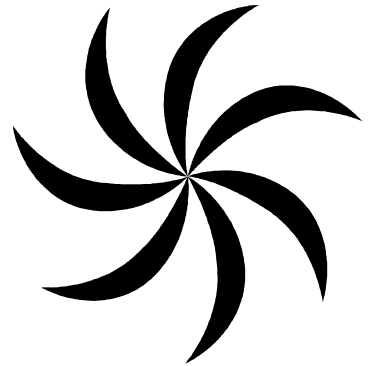
2 The propellers are silent especially after engine shutdown.



3 Wait for complete propeller standstill



4 Even at a standstill, you still have to get around the propellers.



Smoking and the use of lighters or matches on the apron are strictly prohibited.
